## **Greenland in Figures 2010**

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# Greenland - Kalaallit Nunaat

First inhabited for over 4,500 years ago from the northern continent of America by indigenous people and again by Scandinavians for about 1,000 years ago.

Today the country is called Kalaallit Nunaat, which means "Country of the Greenlanders".

Greenland is part of the Danish Realm that consists of Denmark, the Faeroe Islands and Greenland. Greenland has a national flag, issues its own stamps and are a part of the Danish monetary and exchange union.

In 1979 Greenland was granted Home Rule. In November 2008 a referendum on self-government was passed by a majority of votes. Self-government was established on 21st June 2009, the 30th anniversary of the establishment of home rule.





# Fishing and Hunting

Fishing is the primary industry of the country. Greenland has the legislative competence for the fisheries sector. Fisheries for prawns and Greenland halibut are regulated by quota and license regulations decided on by the Cabinet. Decisions are based on biological advice to ensure a sustainable use of the natural resources.







# Political Parties in Greenland

## **Sorlaat Partiiat** (Roots)

Greenlands youngest party, formed in 2008 and not in parliament. The party stands for social liberalism with the government out of the local and national businesses. Democracy, financial independence and integrity are corner stones in this party.

## **Siumut** (Forward)

The largest party in Greenlandic politics, founded in 1977. This party stands for social democratic affairs and equality amongst the people. Loyal to the Danish Crown and Government this party still stands for independence and self-government in Greenland.

## **Inuit Ataqatigiit** (Unified Inuit)

Leftwing oriented party founded in 1976 with demands of independence and recognition as one people. Il-loyal to the Danish Crown and Government the party is somewhat a socialistic party.

## **Kattusseqatigiit Partiiat** (Alliance of Candidates)

Formerly represented by individual candidates. A formal party was founded in 2005. This party is mostly represented in northern part of Greenland.

## **Demokraatit** (Democrats)

A social liberal party founded in 2002 in the middle of the two political wings in Greenland.

## **Atassut** (Unity)

This party was founded in the late 1970'ies. Loyal to he Danish Crown and Government this party of green liberal mentality stands for unity within the Royal Danish Realm.

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## The world's largest island

Geographical Greenland is part of the North American continent, geopolitical a part of Europe. Greenland is a mountainous country and the world's largest island with a total area of 2,166,086 sq. km. Of this 85 per cent is covered with ice, while the rest is free of ice. The temperature of the warmest month does not exceed 10 degrees Celsius. The further north, the colder, drier and less windy it becomes. July is the warmest month, while February and March are the coldest.
